The \$1,000 WINGS grant awarded to the Northfield Fine Arts Boosters - Roger Jenni Instruments for All fund was used to support students in both band and orchestra programs at Northfield schools.

The Northfield Middle School Band Program used the funds to provide summer band lesson scholarships to nine students. The Orchestra Program used the funds to provide scholarships for nine additional



students to help with summer orchestra lessons. Summer lessons keep students' skills sharp over the summer months and are a critical part of student success in the program. The funds were dispersed to students who applied for financial need-based scholarships.

The total request for scholarship funding made by music staff was \$1,326. The Northfield Fine Arts Boosters paid the remaining scholarship requests out of existing funds in the Roger Jenni Instruments for All fund. Because of the WINGS grant, the Fine Arts Boosters were able to fund all scholarship requests.

The Northfield Fine Arts Boosters appreciate the partnership with WINGS to fund Instruments for All and put an instrument into the hands of every Northfield Public Schools student who wants to participate in band and/or orchestra regardless of their family's financial status.

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT



As I reflect on the past year it seems like an appropriate time to pause, reflect and look ahead.

I recognize that we have arrived at this point because of the vision of our founding WINGS members. Their wisdom, spirit, and boldness have been passed along for 18 years. What started in 2000 with 63 women and \$2,100 in grants awarded has grown to 290 women and over \$1 million in grants to be awarded this next year! Just think about that for a moment . . . \$1 million in grants awarded in 18 years! Phenomenal!

When I need to think, ponder and process I love going to the lake. The open expanse of water, the beauty of the visible landscape and the wonder of the unseen helps usher me to a place of peace where I can untangle my thoughts and let them wander, explore and imagine. WINGS Funding Creates New Access for Northfield Youth



Good health is vital to successful development for youth and their families, and teens have unique needs and challenges when it comes to accessing health care services. HealthFinders Collaborative (HFC) sees many teens who fall through the cracks of the formal systems, with real or perceived barriers to accessing care. Together with WINGS, HFC has developed a unique new model of care to reach these underserved populations. HFC's new Northfield clinic space is a unique partnership with Sterling Pharmacy and Northfield Hospital Express Care Clinic. Support from WINGS established a unique teen clinic and mental health consult room at this new location, and was critical to the final implementation. This co-located facility highlights HealthFinders' role as a nexus for the underserved, enhancing their role and capacity as a hub for the local health and wellness system.

The new clinic offers teen clinic hours at a community-visible location to provide youth and reproductive health visits using teen friendly practices. Thanks to WINGS funding, the newly furnished teen consult room is a comfortable, less clinical, space for private conversations. WINGS funding will further be leveraged to support broader school-based programming. This youth development programming and outreach occurs during

and after school at Northfield Middle and High Schools, as well as Greenvale Community School. Programs connect youth and their families with HFC vital resources and support healthy decision-making, positive relationships, and community service. WINGS funding will help build on these successful programs to reach women and youth who are not currently engaged, as well as deepen women's health and teen-specific services to those who already are.

The new teen consult room will also serve as a private consultation space for HealthFinders new mental health services. HealthFinders is hiring a part-time bilingual (English/Spanish) Licensed Marriage & Family Therapist. Other local mental health providers will help as volunteers or on a discounted fee basis. Access to mental health services is a critical need in Rice County. Starting in early January, HealthFinders will begin to address those needs across all program areas including youth services.

Each year, HealthFinders has leveraged funding from WINGS to launch increased services in Northfield locations, move from our Dundas location, and implement our care coordination project. Each of these projects has built on the last and brought together partners in new and lasting ways. This new project will build on our successes achieved to date in Northfield by establishing the new Northfield clinic as a hub for our teen services and extend the impact of our community-based programming.

HealthFinders and their patients are grateful to WINGS members for their commitment to ensuring that everyone has access to the healthcare they need. Thank you!
