

Northfield Poet Laureate, Rob Hardy, wrote the poem Milkweed to honor WINGS at the 2019 annual meeting.

To begin with the milkweed pod, pursed with seeds, opening to give each seed feathered to the wind—I've begun other poems with milkweed because the seed stands for generosity, for faith, for possibility, each seed a small investment in butterflies. To be fair, milkweed propagates primarily at the root, the network of rhizomes sending up new life from the soil,

forming entire communities connected underground.

But even this began with a seed—the promise of connection.

And here's another metaphor: when the monarch caterpillar ingests the milkweed leaf,

it sequesters chemicals from the sap that become part of the butterfly itself a kind of transubstantiation,

the substance of one life becoming

the substance of another.

This is metaphor.

Metaphor is how a poem connects and transforms—the metamorphosis, the chrysalis that holds both caterpillar and butterfly,

that holds both caterpillar and butterfly, and in them both, the milkweed.

We live by metaphors.

The money you give is only a metaphor

for the work it can do-

for the promise of health or shelter,

the book in a child's hand,

real seeds planted in the real earth.

This is how your good becomes the good of others,

how you connect and transform.

This is how you do the work of poetry.

You begin with a seed and turn it into wings. ■

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

A Million Bucks ...

"A million bucks" is a measure of something great or wonderful, as in "she feels like a million bucks." WINGS achieved something wonderful in 2019 – over a million dollars in grants given to support Northfield area women and youth during our first two decades.

Those grants have had a profound impact on the community. I remember when Tattered Pages received a \$750 award to establish the "bookstore" in the Middle School media center where students could exchange earned tokens for free books as holiday gifts. That program continues to this day, much expanded to include Mother's Day, birthdays, and other celebrations where gift-wrapped books are much appreciated. Our first Dare to Dream grant of \$10,000 served as the springboard for the Greenvale Park Community School, which has grown exponentially with additional funding to support students and their families in the Greenvale neighborhood. By the fall of 2020 the community school will be housed in a new building that really will look like a million bucks.

A million is a large number, sometimes too big to really comprehend. Writer Anne Lamott tells a story about her older brother as a youngster. He didn't start his assignment to write about birds until the night before it was due. "He was at the kitchen table close to tears...immobilized by the hugeness of the task ahead. Then my father sat down beside him, put his arm around my brother's shoulder, and said, 'Bird by bird, buddy Just take it bird by bird.""

That's what WINGS has done and will continue to do with our pooled investments and annual grants. Bird by bird, member by member, donation by donation, and grant by grant, WINGS will continue to support women and youth in the Northfield area.

NORTHFIELD UNION OF YOUTH



Northfield Union of Youth was the recipient of a \$25,000 Dare to Dream Bigger grant from WINGS in 2018. This funding has enabled NUY to collaborate fully with the Northfield Area Learning Center to bring planning for the future and current support to youth. From cradle to career, NUY is strengthening its community with holistic approaches to learning, supporting and intentionally reaching out to all youth through the WINGS funding. NUY currently has a staff member at the Alternative Learning Center eight hours a week connecting with students outside the four walls of the youth center. The staff member is a friendly face and supportive adult who both meets youth in a place they are safe, comfortable and already accessing help, and gives all students an opportunity to learn about another community resource available to them - The Key.

An additional grant in 2019 helped to implement the Gaining Opportunity, Access, and Local Stability (GOALS) Education program. NUY worked with eight young people to help them gain valuable credits toward graduation and encouraged multiple youth to learn more about earning their GED throughout the summer. Northfield Union of Youth continues to provide consistency and safety in youth conversations

about reaching personal and academic goals. Through the partnership with the Area Learning Center, NUY provides occasional meals that encourage youth to come to school early, connect with teachers and staff, and find a community that supports them in all life challenges, not just academic endeavors. The last Union of Youth breakfast at the ALC served over 60 youth.
