LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

s this year of my WINGS presidency comes to a close, I am in a sweet spot of reflecting back on all we have accomplished and looking ahead toward what is yet to come. I've seen abundance in growth of membership, grants awarded, creativity in approaching our usual events, and effort in beginning an encompassing strategic planning process. Dedicated committee members have worked diligently bringing their energy and ideas to the Board. Collaboration on four major events that have typically been separate, in-person celebrations or educational gatherings were held virtually with record attendance. The Annual Meeting, honoring of Blue WINGS members, Grants Celebration, and the fall event all exceeded my hopes and expectations this year, although they were implemented differently than in our first twenty-plus years.

Membership grew in varying ways: new women joined, previous members renewed their gifts, and more members than ever contributed at the Blue WINGS level. Further increases in donations included major gifts through legacy funds and matching gifts through members, spouses, and/or partners. The collective impact of your generosity made this year's \$90,000 in grants obtainable!

I was reminded of the 50th Anniversary of Title IX coming up (June 22, 2022) when WINGS received a legacy gift from two local women athletes' charitable fund. For me, as a little girl growing up in the '50's, access to varsity athletic programs didn't exist in the public schools or colleges. Title IX revolutionized and provided for participation by eliminating gender discrimination. WINGS mission of educating and supporting women and youth in our community gives us a voice as voting members. As members, we can make intentional choices about diversity, inclusion, and equity. We get to decide where, how, and to whom our grants are directed. Our actions can and do have a significant influence on the lives of women and youth in Northfield.

WINGS, I am proud to say, is heading into this next year as an enduring all-volunteer organization committed to the vision of our founding members. Moving forward, we will continue our strategic planning process beyond examining our mission, core values, shared goals, and the grants process. We hope to keep building on our strong foundation of reliable funding that supports local women and youth. Do you think it's feasible for WINGS to grant \$100,000 in 2022?

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GREENVALE PARK COMMUNITY SCHOOL MIDDLE SCHOOL INITIATIVE


The Middle School Initiative at Greenvale Park Community School is off to a great start this year! There are a variety of activities offered for middle school students on Tuesday and Thursday evenings at Community School. Middle School Club is a space where students can play games, do handson activities, and hang out with friends. Homework Help is offered all night for students who are hoping to spend more time working on their assignments. The evenings end with gym, which is a very popular option. Students are able to enjoy a variety of activities while staying active.

Thanks to the WINGS Grant, additional staff who support the Middle School Initiative have been hired and supplies for activities that students are interested in have been purchased. Since the start of the school year, 121 students in grades 6-8 have accessed Community School programming - and this number is expected to grow as programming continues to expand.

LOOKING FORWARD:

There are some very exciting developments happening within the Middle School Initiative. In January an AmeriCorps Promise Fellow, whose primary focus will be on providing and expanding middle school programming, will be joining the team. This hire will also spend time with the TORCH program, with a focus on building relationships with students. A Youth Board will be started in February to give students the opportunity to engage as leaders and provide guidance for future programming. In the new year the hope is to see new students, provide new programming, and find new opportunities for growth.
