WINGS HIGHLIGHTS OF 2024

- Dr. Susan Singer, President of St. Olaf College, spoke at the annual meeting.

WINGS 2024 Diaper Report

The cost of diapers is a large but often overlooked expense for low-income mothers. According to the National Diaper Bank Network, one in three U.S. families cannot afford enough diapers to keep their baby clean, dry, and healthy. The Community Action Center (CAC) and WINGS have been addressing this need for years.

CAC first recognized the need for local diaper support at its food shelf, where mothers and their families frequently asked if CAC knew where to find free or low-cost diapers. Families were having to choose between purchasing enough diapers and keeping up with their rent and utility bills.

CAC did not have internal funds to meet this need, but in 2020 WINGS stepped in to fill the gap, providing a grant to stock diapers in CAC food shelves.

In the past four years, CAC and WINGS diaper distribution program has grown by leaps and bounds. For example, in 2023 CAC doubled the size of its program. It went from 80 families a month in 2022 to 150, and from a total of 23,000 diapers to 54,000. In 2024, the program kept growing. About 134 families each month took home a grand total of 82,000 diapers.

The growth of the diaper program over the past five years far exceeded CAC's internal capacity.

In response, CAC decided to take a dramatic step. CAC applied for, and received, designation as an official "diaper bank" from the National Diaper Bank Network (NDBN). It received a similar designation from the MN Diaper Bank. Significantly, CAC is the first such diaper bank in Greater Minnesota. With these designations, CAC can now buy diapers in bulk from NDBN and receive free diapers from the state of MN.

CAC's new institutional partnerships might make WINGS contributions seem less important. Nothing could be further from the truth. In order to unlock free and low-cost diapers, CAC needs to meet certain thresholds, which CAC could not do without WINGS assistance. The result is that \$1 of WINGS funding becomes \$3 or even \$4 worth of diapers.

CAC staff are incredibly grateful for the steadfast support of WINGS. CAC's motto is "neighbors helping neighbors," and with WINGS assistance, CAC is able to meet an important local need.
